

UPDATE ON ERA FROM ROBBIE MADDEN

On Thursday, May 9, bipartisan legislation was introduced in both houses of Congress to remove the deadline for ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment. Action requested:



- Please urge Senators Hagan and Burr to cosponsor Senate Joint Resolution 15, introduced by Senators Cardin and Kirk.
- Also please urge your House member, McHenry or Meadows, to cosponsor House Joint Resolution 43.

It's a free call to the U.S. Capitol: 877-762-8762.

When passed, this legislation will mean that we need only three more states to ratify the ERA, rather than having to start all over. (Few other constitutional amendments have been burdened with a deadline.)
