The Board has faced challenges and has wrestled them to a useful conclusion. Not the end of knotty problems but creative and productive solutions. How grateful I am to the Board I have had the privilege of heading though not always leading.

Be at the May 7 Branch meeting at the First Baptist Church for election of officers! The nominating committee's slate is Joanne Swenson Exec VP, Marlene Shaklan Co-VP Programs, Judy Nelson Co-VP membership, and Portia Alexander, secretary.

AAUW national's annual meeting is coming up and it's time to vote for officers and directors and on policy and issue wording changes. Every AAUW member is eligible to vote on any candidate and issue even if you are not attending the annual meeting. This is a huge opportunity to make an impact on the direction of AAUW. I just voted. Some proposed wording changes are confusing. For example, passage of the ERA (Equal Rights Amendment) was removed from policy goals to an action item. AAUW national will be lobbying for passage of ERA, a boost of significance.

I want to tell you that I voted to remove the degree requirement for membership (Article IV). The conversation about joining us "to advance equity for women and girls through advocacy, education, philanthropy, and research" (AAUW Asheville Branch Directory 2014-2014, p.2) ends when I am find myself talking with someone who has no degree. I want the conversation to continue.

GEM: CHANGING WOMEN'S LIVES THROUGH EDUCATION

Thanks to the generosity of the AAUW Asheville family, GEM awarded 15 scholarships for the current academic year: twelve \$1000 scholarships to students at A-B Tech, plus a special award of \$1500 to a student enrolled in the Culinary Arts program; and two \$2000 scholarships to students at UNCA. This is what GEM is all about.

Over the last thirteen years, the GEM Fund of AAUW Asheville has awarded over 90 scholarships totaling close to \$100,000. The words from this year's scholars show how GEM (and the branch members, friends, and family who support it) have **changed lives**. During that time we have also forged a bond with the scholarship folks at A-B Tech. As a consequence, GEM/AAUW Asheville is the only organization outside of A -B Tech to be allowed to use the facilities at Fernihurst, the location of our annual fundraiser.

2015 GEM FUND DRIVE SALUTES AAUW ASHEVILLE'S CENTENNIAL BIRTHDAY

As you know, 2015 marks the one hundredth birthday of AAUW Asheville. Consequently, GEM 's annual spring fund drive is dedicated to our original founding sisters. Imagine what it would have been like for women in 1915 seeking a college degree. At that time, women did not even have the vote. The barriers facing women seeking higher education in 2015 are different but perhaps no less daunting for many. Hence, in 2002 our branch, in its amazing wisdom and generosity, created the GEM Fund, whose sole purpose is to raise funds to help women whose college careers have been interrupted or delayed. Typically, our scholars range in age from mid-twenties to mid-fifties. What they all have in common is a desire to better their lives — and those of their families — through education. What could be more in keeping with the mission of AAUW? If you have never participated in the GEM fund drive, never been a GEM sponsor, or never contributed in any other way, this year — our Centennial year — would be a great time to start.

The **annual fund drive** begins in mid April and continues through mid June, culminating the in the fundraiser party. At right is the invitation to the party that you should have received in the mail. On page 8, you can read more about party details.

Giving Options

As in previous years, this year's fund drive includes a number of giving options:
