2. Tuesday, October 16, moderated by Candy Crowley, Chief Political Correspondent, CNN, and Anchor, CNN's *State of the Union*
3. Monday, October 22 Bob Schieffer, Chief Washington Correspondent, CBS News, and Moderator, *Face the Nation*

The single vice presidential debate is Thursday, October 11, and it will be moderated by Martha Raddatz, Senior Foreign Affairs Correspondent, ABC News. All of the debates will begin at 9 p.m. ET and end at 10:30 pm ET.

Dear AAUW Friends:

By now, we will have had our first official activity of the membership year – the pot luck dinner at the home of BA Schenck. I know it was a big success with a great location (thank you BA,) food, and friendship. Thanks to all who attended. And special thanks to all the board members and study group leaders for all you've been doing to plan for the coming year and to organize such interesting and enjoyable activities and events.

As promised, here's an update of where we regarding board goals and actions:

Membership – As of September 15, we have 135 members, compared to 123 at this time last year. Thanks to Barbara Robinson and Emily Quinn for their great job in making new members welcome. The mentor program is continuing, so, if you would like to mentor a new member, contact Barb or Emily.

Finances – As of August 31, our AAUW branch has \$8,468 in our checking account. Note that more than half of that amount is owed to AAUW national for membership dues, so the available cash is much less than it appears.

Projects – The sink for the YWCA drop-in center is still in the works but there have been some hurdles to overcome. We'll keep you posted on its progress.
