PLEASE EXERCISE YOUR RIGHT & RESPONSIBILITY TO VOTE!

Here is important information about the May 8th Primary Election & Early Voting that began April 19 & voting in general.**

Check if you are registered to vote at your current address under your current name at <u>NC Board of Elections Voter Search</u> page. Enter your name, check the "I am not a robot" box. Hit the Search button, and when the list comes up, click on your name. That will relay you to **Your Voter Information.**

Near the bottom of the page, click the link to see your primary ballot. If you are listed as "Unaffiliated," you will have your choice request either Republican or Democrat ballot.

Here is a link with dates, times and locations for Early Voting, which runs April 19 to May 4, mostly 10 am to 6 pm, but locations/times vary. Look it up! Or May 5 8 am-1 pm You do NOT need photo ID to vote.

Some tips for the Primary:

- If a race has only one candidate in your party, it will not appear on your ballot.
- Use the League of Women Voters' voter site, <u>Vote411.org</u> that includes the important **Candidate Issue Questionnaires**, **customized ballots** for voters, **polling locations**, as well as **early voting dates**, **locations**, and **times**.
- To learn who the candidates are in all the races -- beyond your own -- AVL Today offers this quide with brief descriptions for each candidate.
- Absentee Ballots Anyone can vote by mail, but you must fill out and sign an Absentee Ballot Request Form and mail it to the Board of Elections. They will mail you an Absentee Ballot. You must fill out the ballot in the presence of two witnesses who sign the envelope as noted -- and mail the ballot to the Board of Elections, using 2 first class postage stamps. Absentee Ballot Request until May 1. Return by May 8 at 5pm
- Same Day Registration if you missed the deadline. You can register during early voting only on the same day you vote. In that case, you will have to provide proof of your ID either a photo ID or a current utility bill, bank statement, paycheck, or govt. document.

For second year in a row, the Asheville AAUW branch participated in A-B Tech's Women in Technology event. A session of StartSmart, AAUW'S salary negotiation course, was presented to 13 participants from three technical colleges.

Our branch is very fortunate to have a member who lends her voice to discuss and combat sexual harassment. **Melissa Maranville,** PhD-C, Adjunct Professor - AB Tech Community College, has devoted 16 years to the study of sexual harassment. Melissa is a strong advocate for women who have encountered sexual harassment. Melissa herself is a rape survivor. Melissa conducted a session on sexual harassment at UNCA on April 17. She shared data on sexual harassment and shared her story of being raped while attending a college party. Melissa was very courageous, she named her rapist and brought the case to court. It was a powerful presentation and UNCA students shared their thoughts on and experience with sexual harassment. I highly recommend that if this is a topic that you feel others would benefit hearing, contact Melissa. A big thanks to Dr. Jill Moffit for setting up this presentation at UNC-A.

Melissa is also the author of the book A Girl Like Me, which will be published this year.



Dear AAUW Asheville Branch Members,

Over the yeas AAUW has changed its by-laws and again this year they have three proposed amendments before the membership for a vote.

The three proposed amendments are:

- Creating 3 year staggered board terms
- Opening board service to those outside of the AAUW membership
- Eliminating the degree requirement for membership

Each proposed amendment can be found on the AAUW website, https://www.aauw.org/resource/national-election/ the overarching motivation for these changes at this time is to uphold and advance AAUW's mission and ensure optimal execution at the national board level.

Some of the bylaw changes in the past have been:

- 1882 Degree from a specific list of colleges or universities
- 1949 Degree from any accredited four-year college or university
- 1987 Membership extended to male college graduates
- 2005 Membership extended to include graduates who hold an associate or equivalent degree from a qualified educational institution

The reason for these changes came about as the board asked - how many potential members are we losing because AAUW has this eligibility requirement? Could it be for women who don't meet the education requirement, or we lose women who share our vision but don't like AAUW because it seems to be an exclusive organization and do we lose donations who don't understand why you much have a college degree to work towards gender equality.

Some members object to the open membership because they are concerned that our name will be changed. AAUW is the forth name we have had in our years of being a membership organization. The name was not changed when AAUW started accepting people who had a community college degree. What we call ourselves is not the end all in their decision to become a more inclusive organization.

AAUW is an organization that fully supports women getting a college education in the field of their choice, but we need to recognize that education comes in many forms.

Over our professional lives we have worked with many women who did not have a

formal degree. This is not a measure of intelligence, sometimes it is the lack of opportunity or choices made early in life that are difficult to reverse.

If you look at the statistics, in 2016, 46% of non-Hispanic white women aged 25 to 29 years completed four years of college. For African American and Hispanic women, the numbers are more stark at 25% and 31% respectively. This suggests AAUW cannot promote equity and diversity for all women and girls if the organization maintains exclusionary membership requirements.

So, the first two proposals would bring AAUW more in line with nationally accepted non-profit best practices and the needs of the organization. AAUW National board feels strongly that while the degree requirement made perfect sense in the beginning, this requirement is now perceived by many as counter to our mission and limits our ability to build the capacity needed to increase our impact as an organization.

At the state meeting that was held on March 24th this was brought to a vote by all in attendance and all three proposals were endorsed without any opposition.

How to Vote for these by-laws:

- April 16th you can go online and request a paper ballot.
- April 26th voting online will begin.
- On June 9th Voting on line will end
- June 10th the results will be announced as to how members voted.

Please make your voice count and have a say in the future of AAUW. We need every woman who supports our mission – empowering women and girls – to join us in the ongoing challenge of achieving gender equity.
